ESSAY: In June 2020, the Kraft family announced the creation of the Kraft Family/Patriots Player Collaborative Fund, which distributes \$100,000 per month for 10 months to local organizations fighting for equity, working to end systemic racism and creating meaningful change in the community. The recipients are chosen by the Kraft family in collaboration with Patriots players.

Similarly, beginning in 2018, Patriots players formed the New England Patriots Players Social Justice Fund which is renewed and funded annually by players, with The Kraft Family contributing \$250,000 annually. Since the fund was formed, more than \$900,000 has been donated to local organizations, initiatives, and members of our community.
